Sherri McDaniel was present to request Council approval for the City to participate as a joint applicant on the Skid Steer Recycling Grant and the Annual Household Waste Grant applications. Ms. McDaniel noted that there was no monetary commitment of the City for either grant if awarded.

MOTION BY COLEMAN, SECONDED BY DAKE TO AUTHORIZE THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE JOINT GRANT APPLICATIONS ON BEHALF OF THE CITY TO PARTICIPATE IN THE SKID STEER RECYCLING GRANT AND THE ANNUAL HOUSEHOLD WASTE GRANT APPLICATION.

Chamber Director Don Vizi addressed the Council with an update on the activities of the Chamber and provided the Mayor/Council with a schedule of upcoming events. Also, Mr. Vizi requested fiscal year 2019-2020 budget funding in the amount of \$5,500. Mr. Vizi informed the Council that the Chamber had recently renewed and been recertified as a Work Ready Community.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Mr. Trey Schott, applicant for zoning map amendment application of 2101 Lexington addressed the Mayor/City Council with four concerns regarding the Council's February 19th findings of fact and decision to have a first reading changing the zone to R-1B. Mr. Schott's concerns were: 1) that there currently no available residential lots; 2) the R-1B zone change goes against the 2018 Comprehensive Plan changes regarding landuse; 3) there is a need for multi-family housing in the community; and 4) R-1B zone change was not was originally applied for and there were no public hearing records for this zone to be considered. Mr. Schott further noted that he objected to the arbitrary zone change being considered by the Council.

MOTION BY BRADLEY, SECONDED BY SIEGELMAN TO APPROVE AND ADOPT THE MINUTES OF THE FEBRUARY 19, 2019 REGULAR MEETING OF THE COUNCIL.

This ordinance was previously given a first reading and significant changes were made and therefore, required another first reading of Ordinance No. 2019-3.

Agenda Item #9, 2nd Reading Ordinance No. 2019-4 Rezoning the Property Located at 2101 Lexington Road from A-1 Zone Designation to R-1B Zone Designation did not receive a request for a second reading and therefore was not given second reading.
